NATIONAL SYMBOLS

NATIONAL FLAG :

NATIONAL flag is a horizontal tricolour of deep saffron (Kesari) at the top, white in the middle and dark green at the bottom in equal proportion. Ratio of the width of the flag to its length is two to three. In the centre of the white band is a navy blue wheel which represents the Charkha. Its design is that of the wheel which appears on the abacus of the Sarnath Lion Capital of Ashoka. Its diameter approximates to the width of the white band and it has 24 spokes.

Design of the national flag was adopted by the Constituent Assembly of India on 22nd July , 1947. Its use and display are regulated by code.

STATE EMBLEM :

State emblem is an adaptation from the Sarnath Lion Capital of Ashoka. In the original, there are four lions, standing back to back, mounted on an abacus with a frieze carrying sculptures in high relief of an elephant, a galloping horse, a bull and a lion separated by intervening wheels over a bell-shaped lotus. Carved out of a single block of polished sandstone, the capital is crowned by the Wheel of the Lawn (Darma Charkha).

In the state emblem adopted by the Government of India on 26 January 1950, only three lions are visible, the fourth being hidden from view. The wheel appears in relief in the centre of the abacus with a bull on right and a horse on left and the outlines of other wheels on extreme right and left. The bell-shaped lotus has been omitted. The words Satyameva Jayate from Mundaka Upanishad, meaning 'Truth Alone Triumphs' are inscribed below the abacus in the Devanagari script.

NATIONAL ANTHEM :

The song Jana-gana-mana, composed by RabindranathTagore was adopted by the Constituent Assembly as the National Anthem of India on 24 January 1950. It was first sung on 27 December 1911 at the Calcutta Session of the Indian National Congress. The complete song consists of five stanzas.It reads :

> Jana-gana-mana-adhinayak, jaya he Bharata-bhagya-vidhata.

Punjab-Sindhu-Gujarat-Maratha Dravida-Utkala-Banga

Vindhya-Himachala-Yamuna-Ganga Uchchala-Jaladhi-taranga

> Tava shubha name jage, tava shubha asisa mange,

Gahe tava jaya gatha, Jana-gana-mana-adhinayak, jaya he Bharata-bhagya-vidhata.

> Jaya he, Jaya he, Jaya he, Jaya Jaya Jaya, Jaya he.

Playing time of the full version of the National Anthem is approximately 52 seconds. A short version consisting of first and last line of the stanza (playing time approximately 20 seconds) is also played on certain occasions. The following is Tagore's English rendering :

Thou art the ruler of minds of all people, Thou dispenser of India's destiny.

Thy name rouses the hearts of Punjab, Sind Gujarat and Maratha Of the Dravid and Orissa and Bengal;

It echoes in the hills of the Vindhyas and Himalayas, mingles in the music of Jamuna and Ganges and is chanted by the waves of the Indian Sea.

They pray for thy blessings and sing thy praise.

The saving of all people waits in thy hand, thou dispenser of India's destiny.

Victory, victory, victory to thee.

NATIONAL SONG :

The song Vande Matram composed by Bankimchandra Chatterji, was a source of inspiration to the the people in their struggle for freedom. It has equal status with Jana-gana-mana. The first political occasion when it was sung was the 1896 session of the Indian National Congress. The following is text of its first stanza :

Vande Mataram! Sujalam, suphalam, malayajam shitalam, Shasyashyamalam, Mataram!

English translation of the stanza rendered by Sri Aurobindo in prose is :

I bow to thee, Mother, richly-watered, richly-fruited,

cool with the winds of the south, dark with the crops of the harvests,

The Mother!

Her nights rejoicing in the glory of the moonlight, her lands clothed beautifully with her trees in flowering bloom, sweet of laughter, sweet of speech,

The Mother, giver of boons, giver of bliss.

NATIONAL CALENDAR :

National Calendar based on the Saka Era with Chaitra as its first month and a normal year of 365 days was adopted from 22 March 1957 along with Gregorian calendar for the following official purposes (i) Gazette of India, (ii) news broad casting by All India Radio, (iii) calendar issued by the Government of India and (iv) Government communications addressed to the members of public.

Dates of the national calendar have a permanent correspondence with dates of Gregorian calendar : I Chaitra falling on 22nd March normally and on 21st March in leap year.

NATIONAL ANIMAL :

The magnificent tiger Panthera tigris (Linnaeus), the national animal of India, is a rich coloured well-striped animal, with a short coat. The combination of grace, strength, ability and enormous power has earned the tiger great respect and high esteem. Out of eight races of the species known, the Indian race, the Royal Bengal Tiger, is found throughout the country except the north-western region and also in the neighbouring countries, Nepal, Bhutan and Bangladesh. The tiger occupies a variety of habitats from dry open jungles, humid ever-green forests to mangrove swamps.

To check the dwindling population of tigers in India, which came down to just 1,827 in 1972, a massive conservation programme was initiated in April 1973, known as the 'Project Tiger'. This project aims to maintain a viable population of tigers in India for scientific, economic, aesthetic, cultural and ecological values. Since then, the tiger population has shown a gradual increase and the census of 1993 puts the tiger population of the country at 3,750. So far, 23 tiger reserves have been established in the country under project, covering an area of 33, 046 sq. kms.

NATIONAL BIRD :

The Indian peacock Pavo Cristatus (Linnaeus) is a colourful, swan-sized bird with a fan-shaped crest of feathers on its head, a white patch under the eye and a long-slender neck. The male of the species is more colourful than the female with glistening blue breast and neck and a spectacular bronze-green train of around 200 elongated feathers. The Female is brownish, slightly smaller than the male and it lacks the train. The elaborate courtship dance of the male by fanning out the tail and quivering the feathers is a gorgeous sight.

The peacock is widely found in the Indian sub-continent from the south and east of the Indus river, Jammu and Kashmir, east to Assam, south to Mizoram and the whole of the Indian peninsula. The peacock enjoys full protection from the people as it is never molested on religious and sentimental grounds. It is fully protected under the Indian Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

SCHOOL FEE

The school fee is to be paid by the 15th of every month. A fine of Rs.10/will be charged from the 16th of the month. The name of the student will be struck off from the school register if the fee along with the fines are not paid by the end of the third month. The fee is to be paid earlier if the 15th of the month or the previous day/s falls/fall on Sundays or any declared holiday/s. Fee for the month of March must be paid together before the final examination begins. At least 50% of the activity fee must be paid at the beginning of the year. In case, a student fails to pay the same till 30th of December a surcharge at the rate of Rs.5/- per month will be collected for the remaining month/s till the end of the academic year. Parents must also follow the circulars and the instructions from the School Office with regard to the school fee and other charges.

1) The School has the following additional facilities like swimming, Computer, Audio-Visual, Special coaching for sports & games, Martial Arts, Cultural and many more activities to develop the personality of the students. Expenses for these activities may vary as the Management may decide upon from time to time. The average expenditure for these activities and others fees is in the range of 5500/- to `17,880 /- per annum approximately, depending on the classes and the expenses likely to be incurred.

No cheque payment will be accepted for Pre-primary to Std IX after 15th March, 2025 and for Std X after 31st January,2025



PROMOTION

- Pupils absent for any reason are not re-examined and those absent from an examination without a valid reason and prior information will be considered as having failed. Absence from a subject excludes a student from being reckoned in the order of merit in the examination. In case of illness, a doctor's certificate must be produced on the same day. Late certificates will not be accepted or honoured.
- 2. Absence from the entire examination involves total loss of marks.
- 3. Absence from one or more subjects amounts to loss of marks in those subjects and excludes the pupil from being considered for prize.
- 4. A student should have attended fully all Periodical tests, class test & annual examination. No students will abstain himself/herself from the assessments except on medical ground
- 5. Wilful breach of any of the regulations for the conduct of examinations is punishable with explusion from the examination room.
- 6. Application for the verification of marks in special cases may be considered, but answer papers will not be shown.
- 7. Promotions will be according to the rules prescribed by the Central Board of Secondary Education from time to time.

GENERAL RULES: ADMISSION

- Only students who complete 6 years (are born between 1st July 2017 to 31st December, 2018) of this year of admission can be admitted to Std I and progressively to other standards. (This rule is subject to change as per the latest government guidelines)
- 2. Pupils cannot be admitted without a Leaving Certificate from the last school attended and if from States other than Maharashtra, the Leaving Certificate should be duly counter-signed by the Education Officer of the Division in which that school is situated.
- 3. Any pupil who desires to join the school fresh from home or from an unrecognised school must produce the official Birth Certificate in support of the date of birth entered in the admission form. Such pupils are subjected to an entrance examination held at the beginning of the academic year and admitted subject to the approval of the Dept. of Education.
- 4. Information regarding admissions for the Academic Year 2025 26, will be displayed on the display board (ground floor), prior to the distribution of admission forms.

WITHDRAWAL

1. Notice of withdrawal should be given only by parents or guardians before the fifteenth of the month, else the fee for the following month will be charged before a leaving certificate is issued. Those who leave in January must pay their fee for the month of February and March also.

- 2. Leaving Certificate will be issued free of charge. No duplicate copy of a Leaving Certificate will be issued.
- 3. No leaving certificate will be granted unless the School Fees are paid in full.
- 4. Students should return library books and pay fines if any, at the time of applying for leaving certificate.

ABSENCE

- 1. Leave of absence can be granted by the Principal alone.
- 2. No student shall be absent from the school without a valid reason. A note of absence must be given in the calendar by the parent / guardian and the same is to be approved by the Principal.
- 3. Pupils absenting themselves without notice for 15 days will be marked 'left' and may not be re-admitted. If re-admitted fresh entrance fee must be paid along with the arrears, if any.
- 4. No leave of absence shall be granted without prior permission obtained by parents or guardians and that too only for serious reasons.
- 5. Absence without leave is liable for punishment either with a fine or any other form at the Principal's discretion.
- 6. A pupil returning to school after an absence of 6 or more days must obtain the Principal's permission before being admitted to class.
- 7. A pupil returning to school after a contagious or infectious disease should also produce a Medical Certificate permitting him to do so.
- 8. If any student is absent during the exam (except for medical reasons) no marks will be allotted and no retest will be conducted
- 9. It is compulsory for students to complete 75% of their attendance in the year to make eligible to take their final examinations.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

- 1. On School days as well as for functions, School children should wear the school uniform. Children who come to school without proper uniform must bring a note of excuse from their parents, else they may be asked to return home.
- 2. Irregular attendance, unjustified or unexplained absence for more than seven class days, habitual idleness, disobedience or objectionable moral influence, frequent failure shall justify dismissal.
- 3. Pupils are responsible to the School Authorities for their conduct both in and outside the School. Hence, misbehaviour in public on streets or in coveyances may invite disciplinary action.
- 4. Running, playing or shouting inside the School building is not allowed.
- 5. Any kind of damage done to School property will have to be made good for.
- 6. Students are expected to co-operate with their Captains, Leaders, Monitors and other School Officials whom they elect to maintain discipline and the ideals of the school. During the absence of the Teacher, the Monitor will be responsible for order and discipline in the class. When students move along the corridors, they must walk in silence and in single line. They should keep to the left. The teacher in the class should be the last to leave.

7. Personal cleanliness and hygiene are expected from all. Shabby, unkept hair will not be permitted. Girls with long hair should plait their hair. It is mandatory for girls to wear hair bands in school campus. Boys must have a proper haircut at all times. Long hair and stylish cuts are not permitted. Colouring, bleaching or highlighting of hair is not permitted.

- 8 All should be particularly careful not to throw any paper, seeds, etc. anywhere in the school premises. They should use the baskets and bins provided for this purpose.
- 9. No books (other than text or library books) comics, newspaper, periodicals, electronic devices-cell phones, cameras, i-pods, i-pads, tablets and storage devices may be brought to school premises without the Principal's Approval.
- 10. The School cannot make itself responsible for books, money, clothes and other articles that are lost. Students must look after their own belongings. It is not advisable to have more money or valuable articles with them
- 11. All students are advised to speak English in the school even in their private conversation for improving their speaking skill.
- 12. Each and every student should endeavor to maintain high standard of the school, by excelling in good manners.
- 13. No student is permitted to buy eatables from hawkers. It is a health hazard.
- 14. Students from Std VI onwards are allowed to wear analogue wrist watches only. Fancy and digital watches or ornaments of any kind, including bracelets, nose pins, rings on fingers, or elaborate earrings are not allowed.
- 15. Students will be kept in any division as per decision taken by the Management.

REMOVAL

Irregular attendance, repeated absence, copying in examination, habitual idleness, disobedience, objectionable moral influence and **FAILING IN THE SAME STANDARD for TWO CONSECUTIVE YEARS** will justify removal from the institution.

BUS SERVICE

Bus service will be provided to students of the school, from Nursery to Std. X on the routes declared by the Management, if there is room on such routes.

Complaints in detail regarding bus service are to be made to the bus contractors through the PRINCIPAL or to be written in detail in the BUS COM-PLAINT BOOK kept in the school.

THE BUS FEE WILL BE CHARGED FOR TWELVE MONTHS OF THE YEAR.

The school authorities accept no responsibility for delay, loss, breakdown or accidents due to any reason. If a child discontinues the use of the bus, the parents shall have to pay fee for the remaining months. The bus will stop only at selected stops and will not enter by-lanes. No responsibility of any sort will be taken if a child is not at the stop on the scheduled time. If the bus fails to come due to some unforeseen reasons, the parents should arrange for their own conveyance and there will be no reduction in fee.

PRIVATE TUITIONS

The school authorities do not approve of the practice of engaging Private Tutors. However, if a student is very weak in a subject or more than one subjects, the permission for the tuition should be sought from the Head of the institution.

If any parent/guardian engages any tutor (from the school staff or any outsider) without filling in the required form and without the permission of the school authorities in writing, it will be taken as a very serious breach of discipline which will lead to disciplinary action against the student.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Pupils are divided into Houses.

Houses Tournaments are held in most of the branches of S ports.

Provision is made for training in art, craft, painting, Indian & Western music. Among ther activities are Dramatics, Debating, Elocution and Excursions. Training is also provided in Karate, Yoga and gymnastics. The aim of these is to train students from their earliest years in the art of public speaking and to discover and develop dramatic and histrionic talent among the students. Prizes are awarded annually to the best individual performers.

Library-An excellent library is maintained by the school where students can peruse a wide selection of magazines and periodicals.

Games and Sports-House Tournaments are held in various branches of sports namely - Outdoors: Volleyball, Hand-ball, Basket-ball, Dodge-ball & Indian Games such as Langdi, Kho-Kho & Kabbadi. Indoors: Table-Tennis, Badminton, Chess and Carrom.

Pupils are entered for inter-school & various other open competitions in athletics, swimming, cycling, table-tennis and badminton. Special training is imparted in athletics and basket-ball.

Facilities for volley-ball, hand-ball, throw-ball, badminton, table-tennis, chess, carrom and physical education are provided. Children who are physically unfit and who produce a doctor's medical certificate may be exempted by the Principal.

Band- The School has formed a Band where pupils are given training in various instruments under the supervision of an experienced Band Master.

Excursions- The students are taken for various excursions and educational tours to places of interest in and around Mumbai and to other places of importance.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE STUDENTS

- 1. Pupils must follow the school regulations regarding punctuality and proper uniform.
- 2. Pupils are expected to stand properly while speaking to the teacher and the Principal.
- 3. Pupils are expected to show courtesy and respect to all.
- 4. They are expected to greet members of the staff and visitors to the school.
- 5. Pupils must stand quietly when teacher enters the class room, greet the teacher and sit down when told to do so.
- 6. Pupils who do not bring books or bring the wrong books to the school may invite punishment.
- 7. Running, shouting and loitering in the school building is not allowed. Pupils must walk quietly when passing along the corridors and staircases. While going to the classes, they must keep to their left.
- 8. Pupils who expect to return late to their homes must inform their parents in advance.
- 9. Books and other belongings must be marked with the owner's name.

- 10. Pupils must not spoil the walls with ink or chalk or carve names on the woodwork or scratch their names and initials on the walls.
- 11. Breakages must be reported to the class teachers. No "hard" ball games should be played in the premises.
- 12. Class socials must be organised with the Principal's approval.
- 13. No pupil should bring more than Rs.30/- per day as pocket money.
- 14. No pupil shall leave the school premises during working hours without the Principal's permission.
- 15. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, disobedience or conduct deterimental to the smooth working of the school will justify dismissal/ punishment.
- 16. Any serious breach of discipline, discourtesy or disrespect to members of the school staff in any way will be dealt with severely.
- 17. Pupils will not be allowed to wear any jewellery or bring any valuable articles to the school. The school will not be responsible for any loss. Pupils must look after their own belongings.
- 18. No novels or periodicals, including comics, should be brought to the school.
- 19. Candidates who are detected giving or obtaining or attempting to give or obtain unfair assistance or who are otherwise detected in any

dishonest act whatsoever will be reported to the Principal and may be expelled from the examination forthwith and refused admission to subsequent examinations.

20. Payment in any form is accepted only against stamped receipts. Management will not be responsible for any payment made without a receipt.

No payments should be made without obtaining a receipt.

INFORMATION RESOURCE CENTRE (LIBRARY) RULES

- 1. The I.R.C. is kept open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on school days.
- 2. Books will be issued for the use of the borrower only. Only one book is to be borrowed at a time.
- 3. The period of lending will be 14 days including the day of issue for the students.
- 4. A book can be renewed for another seven days if the book is not being reserved by any one.
- 5. A book which is temporarily on special demand may be lent for a shorter period than the prescribed period, the librarian may reduce the lending period as the time demands.
- 6. A fine for 1 rupee per day will be levied from the students, if the book is kept beyond the due date.
- 7. Books must be kept clean and used carefully. Writing or underlining in the books is not allowed. Any damage to them must be reported to the school librarian.
- 8. The students whose name a book is issued will be held responsible for the care of the same. He/She will have to bear the compensation for any damage or loss.
- 9. In case of loss of library card, the matter must be reported to the librarian. A duplicate card may be issued against the payment of Rs. 20/-

- 10. Reference books and magazines cannot be borrowed or taken out of the I.R.C.
- 11. Bags, cases and eatables must not be brought into the I.R.C.
- 12. Every pupil should help to keep the I.R.C. clean and tidy and see that the books and magazines are kept in the proper place.
- 13. A pupil guilty of disobedience to the I.R.C. personnel or of disorderly conduct renders himself/herself liable to suspension from the use of the library.
- 14. Strict silence must be observed in the I.R.C. and conversation, if any, must be kept to the minimum.

ALL COMMUNICATION FROM PARENTS OR GUARDIANS REGARDING FEE, ENQUIRIES, PROGRESS OF THEIR CHILD / CHILDREN WITHDRAWALS AND COMPLAINTS MUST BE MADE TO THE PRINCIPAL OR TO THE DEPUTY CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OR SECRETARY OF MAHATMA EDUCATION SOCIETY AND NOT TO ANY OTHER MEMBER OF THE SCHOOL STAFF.

On no account, are parents or guardians permitted to correspond with or interview members of the school staff or enter the classroom without the special permission of the Principal. Complaints, if any, must be brought to the notice of the Principal or Deputy CEO or Secretary of Mahatma Education Society, and if of a serious nature must be given in writing to enable a full and thorough inquiry

It is mandatory for at least one of the parents to attend the Open House.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Every child admitted to the school must wear the complete school uniform, exact in colour and pattern. Pupils without proper uniform may even be refused admission to the class.




